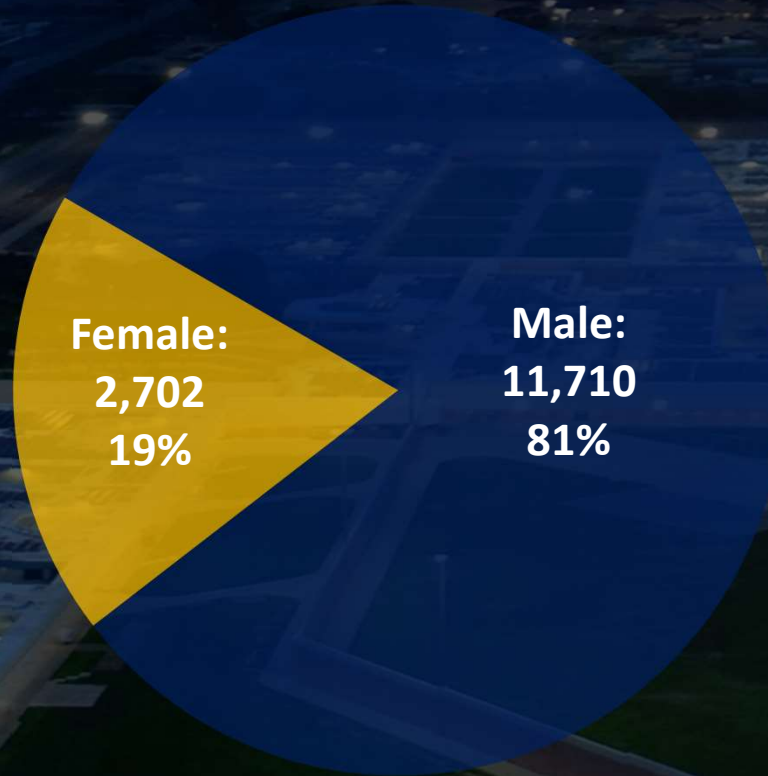

of Unique Bookings



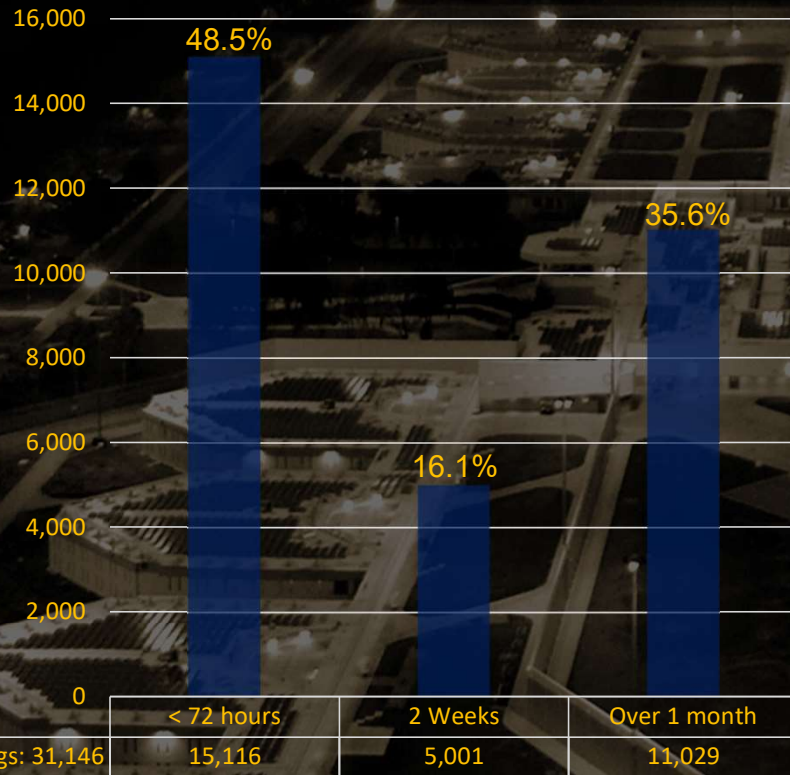
Race Distribution

Duration of Incarceration



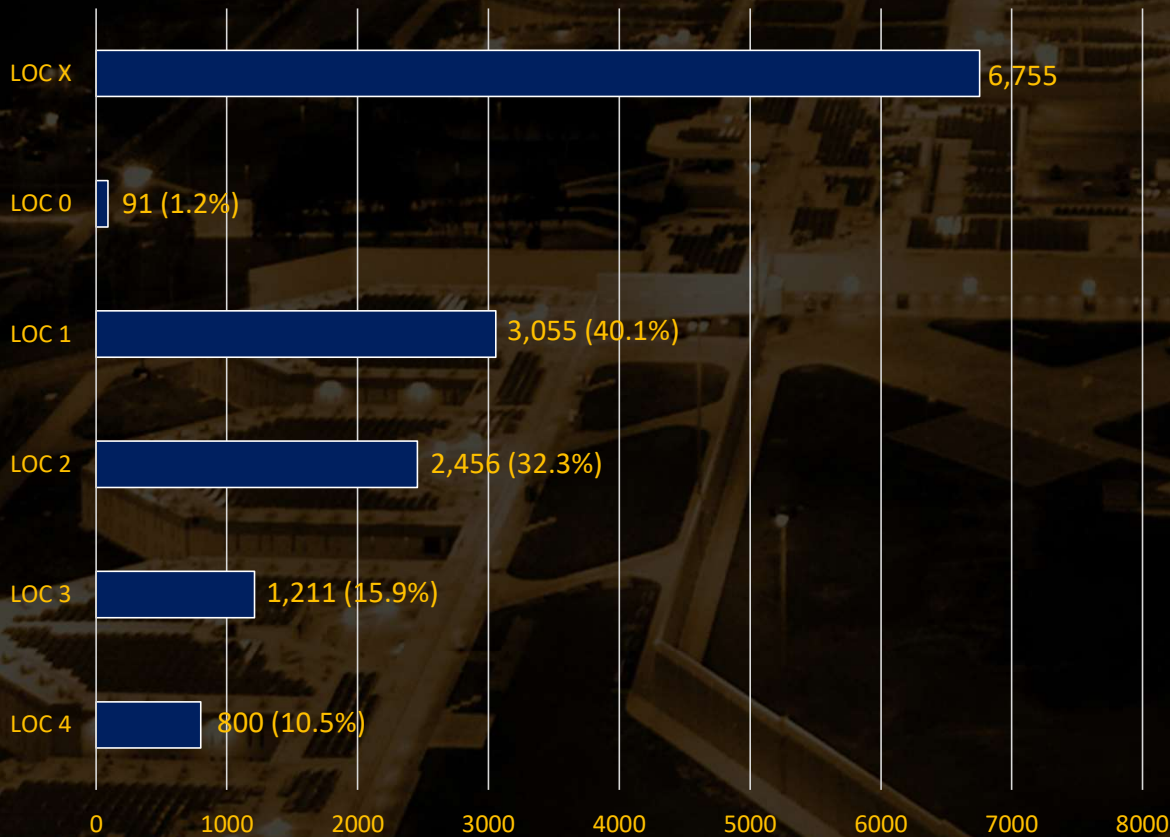
904 speak a primary language other than English

Program Activity



- 418 enrolled in an educational course (356 5 Keys & 62 Chabot College)
- 272 (65%) completed an educational course (242 5 Keys & 30 Chabot College)
- 91,725 online and in-person visits
- 12,793 participated in religious gatherings or saw a spiritual advisor
- 12 CBOs/Service Providers offer resources in the Transition Center
- 373 individuals interested in the Laborer's Union Pre-apprenticeship program
- 3,797 requested housing assistance

Reception Center



Launched in April 2023, the Reception Center provides a safe environment for individuals to access reentry and support services within 24 hours of incarceration. Serving 66% of those booked into housing units, this proactive approach prioritizes successful reentry by connecting individuals with essential resources

ROOTS has dedicated specialized Client Services Coordinators to our reentry efforts in the Reception Center. This collaboration is designed to enhance the support structure for our incarcerated population, ensuring they receive comprehensive assistance tailored to their unique needs.
